One simple but powerful way to **love the 937** is through a **Prayer Walk**. Prayer walking is an opportunity for Jesus followers to pray for our neighbors and neighborhoods. With our eyes and hearts open to the real needs of people, the nudges of the Holy Spirit can lead us into spiritual conversations. We encourage you to walk with people at one of our prayer walking sites. If you are unable to meet at the prayer walking site, prayer walk your neighborhood, hallways of your apartment building or even the streets around your workplace.

1. Begin your walk asking God to open your eyes and your heart to people and needs around you.
2. Expect God and God's Spirit to work through you while you are walking.
3. Pay attention to the nudges that you experience: maybe you will be led to pray over a house/door, stop and talk to a person or even pray over a business and its employees.
4. Sometimes people will say, "No, I don't want prayer." Don't let a "no" discourage you from continuing to walk and pray.
5. Stay safe and walk with others if possible.

Remember **2 Chronicles 7:14**, "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land" (NIV).
